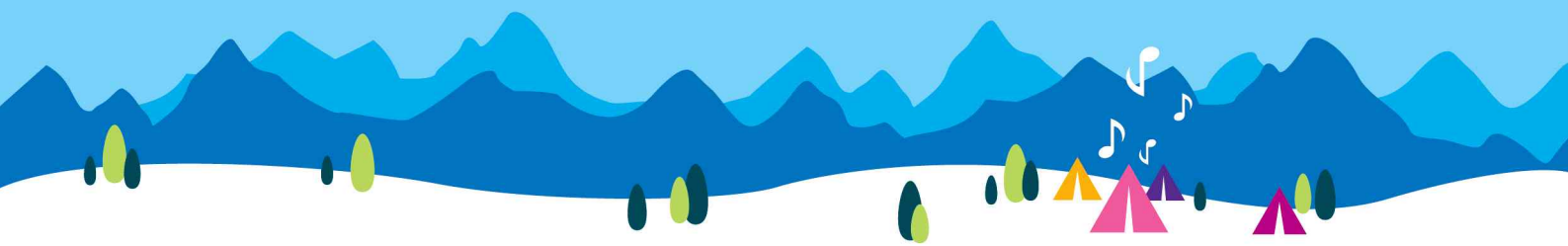

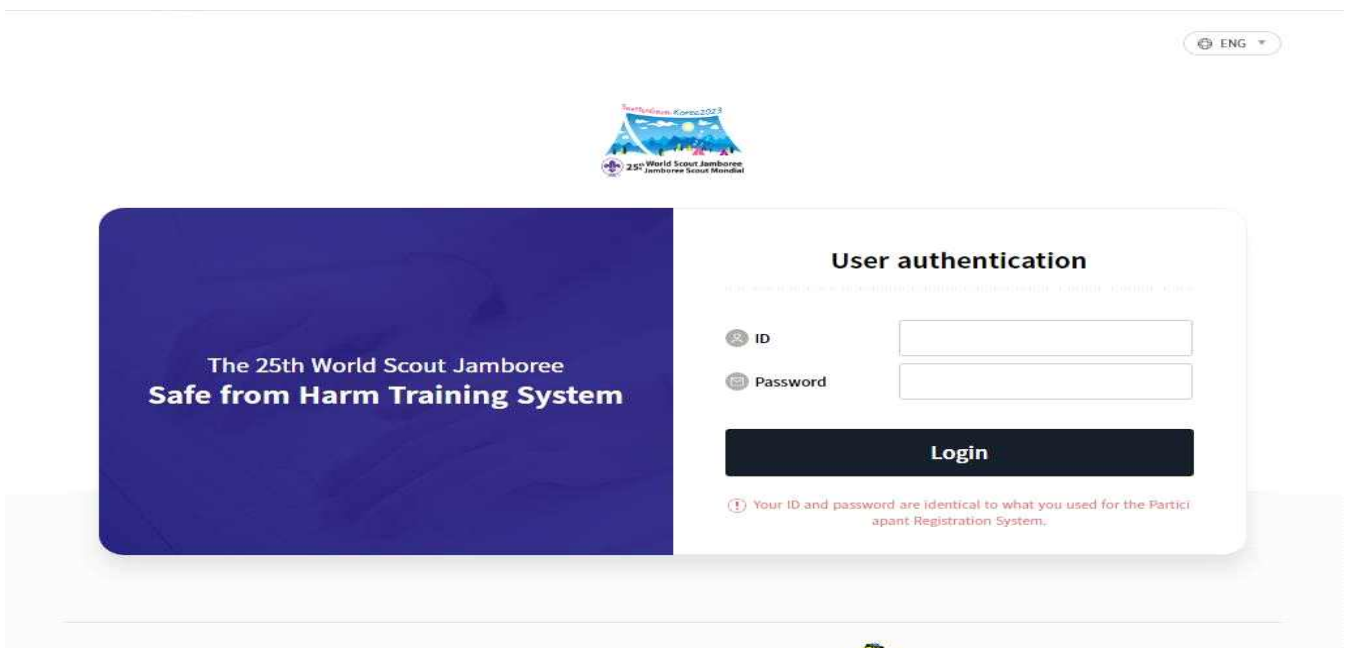


4. Confirm the Code of Conduct and press "Agree" to submit
